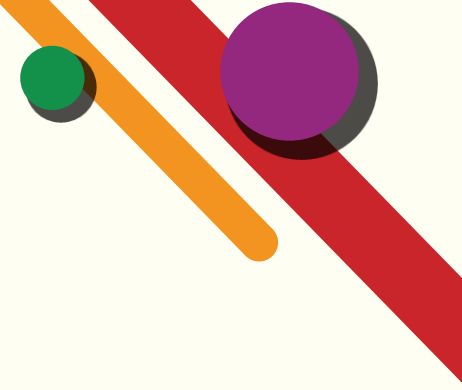

She said the current name was vague, and people don't know what it means. Aber cares relates to the bursary students can access. Some students think the independent student is someone living independently from their parents.</p> <p>Against the idea: No one</p>

		<p>James (SOC) – would it still be for the same students – yes just a different name</p> <p>Millie (FTO) – when applying for funding on Wales student funding - it is called Independent or estranged. Nothing else mirrors the unis stuff. I agree to change the name but not sure on Aber cares and this feels too much like uni.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - It is hard to think of the name that represents all. Independent students don't feel like they are independent. <p>Harley (VO) – if Aber cares changes would this change the name</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - It is free advertisement for the bursary. Being more direct about it can help independent students. 			
	Feedback from Group Discussions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nanw (FTO) agree with Millie – that it is a University thing, the cross over can be a bit strange. The independent officer's name is better but needs better signposting as to what that is. The Welsh translation is also bad. • Ffion (FTO) we agreed and didn't. We think a name change is good but maybe not Aber Cares. I would be worried the officer would be seen as an admin assistant. They are meant to signpost though. I would be worried of duplication. • Espe (FTO) change name but not Aber cares • Millie (FTO) Aber cares makes me think of just carers so that's worse than independent officer. It is hard to come up with something else. Other union have estranged and carers officer. It may be a long name. It may be a marketing issue to show what it actually is.

Idea 2: Approval Process for UMCA President Election	Proposer Speech	<p>Spoken on by Nanw (FTO).</p> <p>Nanw spoke on the idea and stated why this idea was needed. She explained how it currently works and where the problems are with the current way the UMCA President is elected. She explained how it would work going forward if the Senedd is happy to approve.</p> <p>Speak in opposition: No</p>			
	Questions Comment	<p>Melissa (VP): would similar process be implemented with other minority groups?</p> <p>Fran (Chair): explained how voting works for volunteer officers. However, this cannot be implemented by as it would go against charity law as full time officers are trustees.</p> <p>James (SOC) – what’s the idea you want it to be changed to</p> <p>Nanw – it would have to be confirmed with elections. We are not 100% sure of the logistics. There may be a gap between closing standing and announcing candidates where they would be able to meet with the core committee (but not if they are standing in the election) and this would allow the Core UMCA committee to vet the candidates. It shouldn’t impact the time frame of everyone else.</p>			



		<p>Harley (VO)- how will you ensure the process is not abused by the committee? Nanw – we are talking about how it is fair and represented without excluding anyone. It will need to be justified if they do decide to exclude anyone. It would just be to avoid someone saying they want to get rid of Welsh language activity – it would need to be extreme but will be working with the CEO on the criteria for this.</p> <p>Mesh (VO) – would this mean the UMCA committee would reject the president Nanw – if you want to currently stand for UMCA role the things you need is quite weird and strange. This would be more of just a conversation as at the moment you could be valid to stand for the role but not have done any of the other things. Mesh (VO) are there safeguards for someone to come in for an idea that goes against the current committee but is still a good platform. Like if the current committee just doesn't like them. Nanw – we would have to discuss the voice veto but it is a difficult one</p> <p>Elliw (VO) – any rejection has to be justified. The process is in early days. We are not 100% sure on the process but we are aware of this as a flaw. Nanw: It is a voice for Welsh language student, so we need to make sure the person who is elected in is represented of Welsh language students.</p> <p>Tomos (UMCA) – Not everyone here is a member of UMCA so can you explain how UMCA membership feel about this as well. Nanw(FTO)- it falls into the constitution work being done for UMCA. This is a big concern from UMCA members so think this is something we need to keep in mind</p>

Facing this vote can be a concern each year.</p> <p>Harley (VO) what about conflict of interests work Nanw (FTO) - if someone is running in the election they will not be allowed to be part of any part of the process as this would be a conflict of interest.</p> <p>Millie (FTO) what you could do is have a union member of staff or external trustee to also sit in this meeting to mediate it and support in the validation of the process Nanw (FTO) This will be fed back</p> <p>Harley (VO) – will the justification be final and is there anything that can or cannot be included. Fran (Chair) - I think discussion may be going into the process of it. I will allow this question, but this is more stuff that we are currently working on as this is not what we are debating. Nanw (FTO) – any process would be decided with Jacob and Trish to make sure there is a fair process.</p> <p>Elliw (VO) – as the voice of someone taking part in the process that we are in the beginning of the process. We are going through a very old constitution and updating it alongside the union. If you have any concerns, please do talk to us as it is good for us to consider these points.</p>			
	<p>Feedback from group discussions</p>	<p>Gwenno (UMCA) – happy with the idea of the process. Being fluent in Welsh isn't enough – it is more about beliefs. The process is needed to protect UMCA.</p> <p>Millie (FTO) – we are supportive. We know if someone was in the role who hated UMCA it would be detrimental to them. With the upcoming political state is safeguards Welsh in the uni – the uni also wouldn't stand for it</p>			



		<p>Espe (FTO) – agreed it made sense – no concerns.</p> <p>Ffion (FTO) same as others. Many of us are not UMCA so makes sense to listen to the people who are being represented.</p> <p>Harley (VO) when solidified will the process be brought back to Sender Chair – no we vote here and will be raised issues. It will then be planned and organised in details will be worked by the union.</p> <p>Millie – final approval will have to go to the Trustee board.</p> <p>Nanw – we are considering everything that has been raised today. we are looking into these things.</p>

Policy: Free Laundry Services in University Accommodation	Questions and comments	Fran (CHAIR) explained why we are bringing this idea back to the Senedd to discuss what we can do.			
	Question 1: What are the challenges facing students	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Espe (VO) We understand where the issues have been. Would it be worth talking to other unions to see what they are doing and making a commotion to say if students are paying for it, it should work better. - Harley (VO) – terrible service and very expensive. The company doesn't treat workers well. I have heard stories of mould in washing machines. 			



		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Tanaka (FTO) maintenance problems. Students would have more faith in the system if they knew regular services were happening. Students don't expect much from it. - Millie (FTO) the price you pay should reflect. 3 are down last week so people are cramming more laundry in to those that work. You can message to get your money back if the stuff doesn't work and maybe the union can advertise this. EG, if you dry your clothes and it doesn't work you can get money back – you need to be persistent. 			
	<p>Questions 2: What is the most important and ideas for the union</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Millie (FTO) – advertising piece telling people how much to put in a load and what to do when something is broken. We need to investigate who fixes (circuit or the uni) If its uni maintenance can we report it through uni systems? - Tanaka (FTO) – posters in laundry to say 'hey did you know you can get money back if it doesn't work.' Give cheaper alternative likes hand washing if you cannot do the laundry. Find out the key contact at the uni who is in contact with circuit laundry. - Harley (VO) help student reduce dependency on circuit laundry. Say all accommodation has a clothes horse. - Elliw (VO) the union needs to show that this is something the union is working on. Do we need to do more to promote policies to students. - Espe (FTO) build a relationship with circuit laundry. On their website it says they have laundry ambassadors and a manager who overseas students but they don't say who it is.

Gwybodaeth gefndirol:

Yn sgil penderfyniad a basiwyd yng Nghyfarfod Cyffredinol Undeb Aberystwyth fis Mawrth 2025, lleihawyd nifer rolau y Swyddogion Llawn Amser o bump i bedwar. Yn rhan o'r ailstrwythuro hyn, caed gwared ar y Llywydd, a dosbarthwyd ei ddyletswyddau a'i gyfrifoldebau ymysg y Swyddogion Llawn Amser yn weddill.

Daw y Llywydd a Llywydd UMCA a Diwylliant Cymru yn aelodau'n awtomataidd o Gyngor y Brifysgol fel llywodraethwyr o'r myfyrwyr. Gan nad oes gan Undeb llywydd mwyach, mae swydd wag na roddir yn awtomatig i swyddog (arhosith



Llywydd UMCA ar y Cyngor) a'r Senedd fydd yn gyfrifol am benderfynu pa un o'r Swyddogion eraill gaiff eu penodi i lenwi swydd wag lywodraethwr o'r myfyrwyr.

Beth yw Cyngor y Brifysgol?

Cyngor Prifysgol Aberystwyth yw "corff llywodraethol goruchaf Prifysgol Aberystwyth". Mae'n gyfrifol am "benderfynu ar gyfeiriad strategol y Brifysgol ac am y modd y gweithredir materion ariannol a gweinyddol, a materion eraill y Brifysgol, yn unol â'i hamcanion". Mae'r Cyngor yn sicrhau bod y Brifysgol yn gweithredu'n effeithiol, yn aros yn gynaliadwy yn ariannol, ac yn cydymffurfio â phob gofyn cyfreithiol a rheoliadol, gan gefnogi cenhadaeth a gwerthoedd hir dymor y sefydliad. Mae'r Ordinhadau yn amlinellu cyfansoddiad, pwerau a swyddogaethau'r Cyngor.

Mae Aelodaeth y Cyngor yn cynnwys aelodau allanol annibynnol a benodir am eu harbenigedd a'u profiad, cynrychiolwyr o staff y Brifysgol, a chynrychiolwyr o'r myfyrwyr. Gyda'i gilydd, mae'r Cyngor yn dal arweinwyr uwch y Brifysgol i gyfrif ac yn gwneud penderfyniadau ar lefel uchel a gaiff effaith ar y Brifysgol gyfan.

Er enghraifft, mae Cyngor y Brifysgol, i bob pwrpas, yn cyflawni swydd gyfateb i Fwrdd Ymddiriedolwyr Undeb Aberystwyth, ond yn gyfrifol am y Brifysgol i gyd.

Mae mynychu y Cyngor yn gyfrifoldeb sylweddol, gan fod y Cyngor yn trin materion o bwys mawr i'r sefydliad, gan gynnwys blaenoriaethau strategol, pwysau ariannol, a phenderfyniadau gaiff argraff hir dymor ar fyfyrwyr. Mae hefyd ymrwymiad amser sylweddol ynghlwm â'r safle gyda mynychu sawl cyfarfod wyneb yn wyneb y flwyddyn ynghyd â'r is-bwyllgorau niferus wrth wraidd y cyngor.

Hoffem i'r Undeb adlewyrchu safiad mwy diweddar ar hil ac ethnigrwydd gan newid y termau. Yn ei adroddiad, a gyhoeddwyd fis Mawrth 31 2021, canfu y Comisiwn ar Wahaniaethau Hiliol ac Ethnig nad yw termau megis 'DALIE (BAME)' (Du, Asiaidd a Lleiafrif Ethnig) yn fuddiol mwyach ac y dylid cael gwared arnynt, gan ddadlau dros ffocws ar ddeall gwahaniaethau a chanlyniadau ymysg grwpiau ethnig penodol.

Cyhoeddwyd ymateb y llywodraeth i'r Comisiwn fis Mawrth 17 2022. Ceir yn hwn cynllun gweithredu arloesol â'r bwriad o fynd i'r afael â gwahaniaethau negyddol, hybu undod. Mae hefyd yn cynnwys ymrwymiad i roi'r gorau i'r term 'DALIE' yn y llywodraeth.

Ond pam fod hyn o bwys?

Caiff 'DALIE' ei ddefnyddio yn aml at drin pob lleiafrif ethnig gyda'i gilydd. Mae DALIE yn ymddangos yn ffafrio rhai grwpiau hiliol dros eraill. Er enghraifft, byddai Teithwyr Gwyddelig yn dod o dan 'DALIE' megis Lleiafrif Ethnig yn ogystal â grwpiau eraill â gwahanol hunaniaethau a phrofiadau. Nid yw DALIE yn cwmpasu hunaniaethau ethnig yn yr un modd ag y byddai Mwyafrif Ethnig Byd-Eang (MEBE / S. GEM) yn eu cynnwys er enghraifft. Mae Mwyafrif Ethnig Byd-Eang, er ymhell o fod yn berffaith yn achos Aberystwyth, yn creu rhyw fath o gydbwysedd. Gallai'r defnydd o DALIE guddio gwahaniaethau mawr rhwng grwpiau ethnig o ran canlyniadau. Er enghraifft, rydyn ni'n deall bod cyrhaeddiad ym myd addysg ar draws gwahanol grwpiau ethnig yn gymhleth.

Yn 2019, bu canran uwch na'r arfer o blant o gefndiroedd Tsieineaidd, Indiaidd a Bangladeshi a enillodd ganlyniadau uchel mewn Saesneg a Mathemateg TGAU. Ond byddai edrych ar y canlyniadau hyn o safbwynt 'DALIE' fod wedi rhoi camagraff, gan guddio llwyddiant y grwpiau penodol hyn a thanberfformiad eraill.
